RICHARD CURRINGTON

Richard Currington died peacefully April 23, 2002 from a stroke during bypass surgery in Bellingham.

One of seven children, he was born in Seattle on January 16, 1926 to parents Charles and Pearl.

He spent his formative years in Seattle then joined the Merchant

Marines when he was 16. A year later he signed up for the regular Navy and was sent to fight in the Pacific Theatre.

After WWII, he moved to Alaska where he spent the next 40 years managing airports, mining for gold, and working on the Alaska pipeline. While working in Southeast Alaska he was adopted by the Tlingit Indians. He retired from the Teamsters as a business agent in 1987.

During his life, he enjoyed gardening, canning, gold mining, traveling and hypnotherapy. He particularly loved traveling with his wonderful wife, Betty. They had many adventures all over the world but Dick never forgot to pack his sense of humor. He once boasted that he had gotten sick in over 25 countries on six continents.

He and Betty were also involved in a number of local organizations in Mt. Vernon including Master Food Preservers, Master Gardeners, and the Gleaners. No family member

ever went home without an armload of fresh, dried, and canned fruit from the fields around Skagit County.

A Navy veteran of WWII, he was one of the first Americans to enter Nagasaki after the war. There he witnessed the devastation of the atomic bomb and helped free a POW camp. He rarely spoke of this. It was only recently that his family learned that he had refused several medals for bravery.

Dick and Betty's home was always filled with family and children. They miss him dearly.

He is survived by his wife, Betty; his two sons: Gary of Fairbanks, AK and Paul of Olympia, WA; his step-daughter, Brenda Kinzer of Lyman, WA; two sisters: Kathleen Hakala of Seattle and Evelyn Doyle of Phoenix, AZ; his grandson, Taran Currington; and granddaughters: Erica and Nikki Wallen, Diane Kinzer, Kimberly and Tiffany Chapman; and numerous nephews and nieces.

He was preceded in death by his daughter, Linda; his mother and father; his sister, Margaret; and brothers: Jim, Hap, and Clyde.

A memorial service will be held Saturday, April 27 at 2:30 pm at First United Methodist Church in Mount Vernon.

Girl, 13, Dies After Collapse Near Home

Evelyn M. Hakala, 13, of 8335 11th Av. N. W. died about 3:45 o'clock yesterday afternoon after she had collapsed on a sidewalk about 25 feet from her home.

Coroner John P. Brill, Jr., said the death apparently was due to natural causes. He ordered an autopsy, however.

Evelyn, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Alfred Hakala, was returning from a shopping trip downtown when she collapsed.

A Fire Department first-aid crew and a physician summoned by the parents were unable to revive the girl.

Also surviving are a sister, Ellen, 11, and a brother, Jerry, 10.
